



Construction of our new Hall of Geological Wonders will be completed in a few short weeks, and fabrication and installation of an incredible array of exhibits will commence. Our target: a grand opening in the spring of 2009! The Hall of Geological Wonders is phase 1 of our vision for the museum: *Our southwest, points in time.*

And that's not all! We are already busy with phase 2 of our plan to reinvigorate our permanent galleries: the Hall of History is becoming "Crossroads in History," the land and water bird halls are slated to take wing as "Life in the Air," and plans are underway for the redesign of the Hall of Mammals: "Life on the Land."

What all this means is that your museum is stepping forward to take its place as a premier destination in inland Southern California—an exciting and educational experience for you and your family, and a focus for visitors to experience the cultural and natural heritage of inland southern California and our southwest. But this also means that 2008–09 will be full not just of exhibits and programs, but of construction projects! 
